

Standards of Conduct and Parental Agreement of Philosophy

Mission and Purpose of Parkview Baptist Academy: Parkview Baptist Academy is an educational institution which strives to assist parents and Bible believing churches in the task of training young people in reaching their fullest potential spiritually, academically, socially, and physically. Parkview Baptist Academy promotes a Biblically based philosophy that guides young people in developing a personal, loving and trusting relationship with Jesus Christ which will impact an ever changing world.

We believe the following items are essential to the successful education of your children. A common mind is necessary for the successful completion of the above mentioned mission and purpose (Phil. 2:2). We ask that you and all students 7th – 12th grades read each item and sign at the bottom. Your signature represents a commitment on your part to re enforce these same philosophies at home. A common mind with a common goal with the Lord's help and guidance will guarantee success. We count it a privilege to work with each student that is directed to PBA and look forward to the opportunity to work with you.

- God commands Church attendance. (Heb. 10:25) At least one parent and each child that attends PBA should faithfully attend your local church.
- PBA derives the majority of its income from tuition paid by the parents of the students. We count on your faithfulness in this area. Accounts that fall 45 days past due will forfeit the privilege of attending PBA until account is made current or acceptable arrangements can be made.
- We believe young men and ladies should act and dress in a Godly manner. Modesty is the key word (I Timothy 2:9) Be familiar with the dress code rules and follow them with a good attitude. Gripping and complaining will not be tolerated. We believe we will answer to God for what we allow the student to wear to school; therefore, we have established some guidelines we know are Christ honoring.
- We believe that homework is an integral part of the school program. Each teacher should keep homework to a minimum but will surely assign some. We need the parents' full cooperation in seeing that assignments are completed.
- PBA stands strongly against rock music of any kind. We will teach and preach against it and it is prohibited on our campus, in the school parking lot, or at any school activity. A choice to attend PBA is a choice to abstain from rock music of any type (hard, soft, acid, Christian, ect...).
- Philippians 4:8 teaches us to think on Godly things and we are further commanded to have the mind of Christ in Phil. 2:16. We need your support to guard your mind against potentially harmful things such as pornographic literature, certain television shows and/or movies that should be avoided.
- The possession and/or use of drugs, tobacco, or intoxicating beverages on or off campus will be subject to immediate expulsion.
- An attitude of respect for adults is to be maintained by the student body. The terms Miss, Mrs., Mr., or Brother or Sister should be given respectfully, regardless of time or place. Students should always answer with "ma'am" or "sir".
- The administration of PBA places much confidence in the judgment and ability of our godly, Spirit-filled teachers. All parents and students should understand that the administration will support the teacher in matters of discipline. Any parent or student with a legitimate complaint about a disciplinary procedure or method should talk to the teacher first before contacting the principal or pastor.
- Proper Christian conduct with the opposite sex will be emphasized and observed both on and off the school campus. Romans 13:14 teaches us that we should avoid situations that would cause us to fulfill the lusts of the flesh. PBA does not permit displays of affection such as kissing, hand holding, walking arm-in-arm, or any other act of physical contact that is intentional.
- Absenteeism should be avoided as often as possible. When a student is not in class it always affects their grade. While some seem to be able to make up their work better than others; we have set an attendance requirement of missing no more than 20 days of school for any reason. Failure to meet this standard may result in loss of credit or retention in the same grade.
